<b>4. Course Content</b>		
1.	Brief description of the course and its content including details of any sub-divisions	<i>The course consists of a work placement within the field of Archaeology and Classical Archaeology and Ancient History. The subject matter of the practical work placement can vary depending on the area of specialisation selected by the student and the field of activity of the various work placements. Work placements may take place at archives, museums, companies, county administrative boards etc. Organisations running</i>

		<i>projects outside Sweden may also be included. The department has the final responsibility for organising the work placements for the students, but students may also take an initiative to organise placements. In these cases, placements must be approved by the programme management.</i>
